### **Student Housing**

If a student applies for on-campus housing, UTSA is entitled to check the student's criminal history record. If information contained in the record is used to deny on-campus housing to the student, the student will be notified

# The College of Education and Human Development

The College of Education and Human Development (COEHD) prepares educators and professionals for fields that require fieldwork, internship, practicum, service-learning, and/or clinical teaching. Placements occur in educational, clinical, healthcare facilities, hospitals, and/or medical settings that require a criminal background check. UTSA is required to inform students of the requirements set forth by the Texas Occupation Code, Chapter 53, Sections 53.001 through 53.105 (https://statutes.capitol.texas.gov/Docs/OC/htm/OC.53.htm).

All COEHD prospective students in a licensure or certification program are required to acknowledge that they have been made aware of these requirements and that they have read the COEHD Criminal History Policy (https://education.utsa.edu/professional-preparation/teacher-certification.html). For more information and to complete the acknowledgment form, please visit the Office of Professional Preparation and Partnerships in the College of Education and Human Development.

#### **Educator Certification**

In accordance with state law, the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) may suspend or revoke an educator's certification or refuse to issue certification for a person who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor for a crime that is directly related to the duties and responsibilities of the teaching profession (Texas Occupation Code, Section 53.021).

## The Department of Social Work

Some field practicum sites for the Master of Social Work (https://hcap.utsa.edu/social-work/current-students/) may require background checks of social work students prior to placement and may require the student to obtain this report themself. The outcome of this action may result in a student being accepted or denied by the field practicum setting. Students may be responsible for covering the cost of the background check, depending on the agency.
